BLS For Healthcare Providers

CPR Certification for persons involved in direct patient care; physicians, PA's, nurses, CNA's, radiology, nursing students, and EMS workers.

Heartsaver CPR

CPR Certification for persons who are required by their employer to be certified in CPR but do not take part in direct patient care. This certification would be for daycare providers, teachers, camp workers, dental offices, clinic office staff, hospital staff not involved in direct patient care, and any other non-medical business requiring CPR certification.

Heartsaver AED

CPR Certification including operation of the Automated External Defibrillator. Course is for anyone who works for an organization that has an AED.

CPR for Family & Friends

This is a course for citizens who wish to learn CPR for their own knowledge and do not need to be certified in CPR. This is an information only format with no testing.

Heartsaver First Aid

This course covers immediate care of conditions such as burns, bleeding, poisoning, seizures, bites & stings. This is a 2 year certification which meets the requirements for persons requiring First Aid as part of their employment, such as daycare workers.

Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS)

Course is intended for persons who may be required to respond to crisis of a pediatric patient. Course consists of lecture, practical skills, written and skills testing. Applicants must hold current certification in BLS.

Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS)

Course is intended for persons who may be required to manage a patient experiencing a cardiac emergency and includes use of manual defibrillation, cardiac rhythm interpretation, use of cardiac medications and advanced airway control. Applicants must hold current certification in BLS

Pre-hospital Life Support (PHTLS)

A 16 hour course is intended for healthcare workers and covers initial assessment and treatment of a patient involved in trauma. Course consists of lecture, practical skills, written and practical skills testing.

Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC)

A 12 hour course including classroom and actual behind the wheel instruction in areas such as controlled braking and evasive maneuvers.

First Responder Course

A 40 hour course covers immediate life-saving techniques and use of EMS equipment used in the initial treatment and stabilization of an ill or injured person.

Basic EMT Course

A 110 hour course which meets the standards of the Dept. of Transportation in preparation for certification testing by the National Registry of EMT's. Course is intended for persons entering into the EMS field. Course consists of lecture, practical skill and clinical experience.

EMT Intermediate Course

A 110 hour course covers advanced assessment and care of the patient in the pre-hospital environment. Includes training in advanced airway techniques, IV therapy and advanced trauma care. Applicants must hold current certification as a Nationally Registered EMT Basic.

EMT Paramedic Course

A 10 month course consisting of approximately 1200 hours, which involves classroom and clinical experience. Course topics include advanced airways, IV therapy, medication administration, cardiac monitoring. Applicants must hold current certification as a Nationally Registered EMT Basic.
